The U.S. District Court for the District of Minnesota is requesting wireless mobility solutions on GSA Special Item Number (SIN) 517312 quotes for a base year and option years for the items described below.

The main offices for the District Court in the District of Minnesota (The Court) are in Minneapolis, with divisional offices in St. Paul, Duluth, and Fergus Falls. Employees and Judges use their smart phones extensively in and around each of these locations and while commuting between the offices. Devices are also used when traveling nationally and internationally.

The Court currently has fifty-seven (57) smart phone lines, twenty-two (22) data-only (MiFi or cellular iPad) lines, and one (1) data and Wi-Fi watch line. Many of the Court's smart phone lines have tethering (aka mobile hotspot) enabled. During the base and option years, The Court may require more or fewer lines than are currently used. Based on individual coverage needs, The Court may select multiple awards.

REQUIREMENTS

- The Court requires services capable of voice and data access, both individually and combined, in Minneapolis, St. Paul, Duluth, and Fergus Falls. Voice and data access between these locations is required. Voice and data coverage throughout the rest of the State of Minnesota is also a major consideration in The Court's needs.
- The Court requires a plan for smartphones that includes unlimited voice, text, data and hot spot data, to avoid overage charges.
- The Court would like to receive an unlimited data quotes for iPad devices.
- The Court may require overlapping transitions if needed.
- The Court requires that either the Court's currently owned devices are compatible with the vendor's network, or that the vendor will provide equivalent (or superior) replacement device options and costs.
- The Court requires a plan that provides WPS (Wireless Priority Service) to give priority access to the network.
- The Court requires the vendor to indicate in its bid the costs or conditions associated with adding new lines to the plan after the plan has started.
- The Court requires easy access to international services for Court devices, with minimal administrative effort and cost to transition to and from international service.
- The Court requires unlimited tethering (aka mobile hotspot) capabilities for specified lines, as needed.
- The Court requires detailed information for each invoice, including any costs incurred

- through in-state, national, or international roaming charges.
- The Court requires administrator and user training be provided (as needed).
- The Court requires all documentation, manuals, and guides related to the hardware and software the Court purchases. This shall include any warranty information.

Using the quote sheet provided herein, email your quote no later than the date and time specified above. Late quotes will not be considered unless The Court determines, at its own discretion, that considering the late quote is in The Court's best interest and will not unduly delay the procurement.

The Court intends to make an award(s) based on the **lowest priced, technically acceptable** quote. All items should be quoted as a **fixed price** and **F.O.B. Destination**. Payment terms will be considered **Net 30** unless more favorable terms are offered.

EVALUATION FACTORS

Criteria used to determine 'technically acceptable' will be:

- Voice and data coverage in between Minneapolis, St. Paul, Duluth, and Fergus Falls, without roaming.
- Voice coverage through at least seventy percent (70%) of the state, without roaming.
- Data coverage through at least fifty percent (50%) of the state, without roaming.
- 5G coverage.
- Voice dialing support.
- Support for voice mail.
- Support for tethering, both domestically and internationally.
- International calling plan options (global) and ease of switching to and from them.
- Customer service options.
- Self-service options, such as an online portal, and their ease of use.
