THE COURT: Good morning to everyone. 6 7 extent that one or more individuals is wondering why this time of the morning, rather than starting at 8:15 with the 8 9 in-chambers conference, that was my schedule that caused 10 that today that we set that up. 11 We will go back to the normal schedule on June 4th 12 which we will get to at the end. But, with that in mind, why don't we first have counsel note their appearances for 13 14 the record? We can start with Plaintiffs' counsel and then 15 we will move to defense counsel. 16 MS. ZIMMERMAN: Thank you. Good morning, Your 17 Honors, Genevieve Zimmerman for the Plaintiffs. 18 MR. GORDON: Good morning, Your Honors, Ben Gordon for the Plaintiffs. 19 20 MS. FLEISHMAN: Good morning, Your Honors. Wendy Fleishman for the Plaintiffs. 21 2.2 MR. RUDD: And Gordon Rudd for Bucky Zimmerman on behalf of the Plaintiffs. 23 24 THE COURT: Is that microphone on there? 25 little green light?

1 MR. RUDD: There it is. Gordon Rudd for Bucky Zimmerman on behalf of Plaintiffs. 2 3 MR. KENNEDY: Good morning. Eric Kennedy on 4 behalf of Plaintiffs. 5 MR. DeGARIS: Annesley DeGaris, Your Honor, on behalf of the Plaintiffs. 6 7 MR. NEMO: Good morning, Your Honors, Tony Nemo on behalf of the Plaintiffs. 8 9 MR. BERNHEIM: Good morning, Your Honor, Jesse 10 Bernheim on behalf of the Plaintiffs. 11 THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: For the Defense? 12 MR. GRIFFIN: Good morning, Tim Griffin on behalf of the Defendants. 13 14 MR. CAMPILLO: Good morning. Ralph Campillo on behalf of the Defendants. 15 16 MS. CATULLO: Good morning, Your Honor, Kim Catullo on behalf of the Defendants. 17 18 THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: And, of course, the 19 reason I made reference to the microphone, we have a number 20 of people appearing by phone, not the least of which is -- I 21 guess it is appropriate to say what we said back in chambers 2.2 when we announced to the group that we had Pete Flowers on. 23 And he is on now, too, back there. And we just assumed 24 Plaintiffs' lawyers controlled the Chicago International 25 Airport and all of the planes. But, he is stranded down

there in Chicago, so he appeared there.

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So, with that in mind, we can go to the -- have a short, relatively short agenda today, but we can proceed with the report on the MDL enrollment status. Who is going to step to the podium, maybe together?

MS. ZIMMERMAN: I think together, Your Honors.

THE COURT: All right.

MS. ZIMMERMAN: And we do have just a -- again, Genevieve Zimmerman for the Plaintiffs. We have a very brief agenda for today's MDL status conference. I think we are both pleased to report to the Court that we have very robust participation so far in the settlement program. We are not quite at the 95 percent participation rate required by the Master Settlement Agreement, but we are hopeful we will get there.

And for the benefit of the folks listening on the phone, to the extent you have any questions, we would welcome those certainly on the lead counsel committee. I know a lot of folks have been reaching out specifically to liaison counsel, Tony Nemo.

We have had two extensions that have been effective in increasing our participation rate, and really, those have had to do with additional lienholder insurance company issues and I think that as we have done the extensions, that has really been to the benefit of both the

Plaintiffs and their attorneys in understanding how these lienholder resolution programs will work for their benefit.

MS. CATULLO: Counsel --

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THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: And I can just indicate that the lienholder issue is not unique to this case and that is an issue that comes up in the other cases I have had, and similar issues. So, I understand why you are saying that.

We can hear from defense counsel and maybe one or both of you can just, to -- if not refreshing other people's memories for some of us older folks in the room, just kind of where that leaves us with some of the timelines that are in effect. I mean, they are all in the Orders, currently. And then I interrupted counsel before you were going to follow-up, so --

MS. CATULLO: Well, Judge, the new enrollment deadline is April 17th. And as Ms. Zimmerman said, everything is going well, but there is still a lot of work to be done. I can tell you we are all working around the clock, literally answer questions and helping folks understand the nuances of the program.

I encourage people to reach out and get these appointments for special masters. There are a lot of them that are ongoing but that has been, I have heard, a great resource to counsel who just need a little bit more

assistance with certain difficult cases or difficult clients. So again, I would encourage folks to do that.

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The deadline, the key deadline right now is April 17th. That is not going to move. So people need to work hard to get their complete forms in for that.

And yes, the lien issue was another major issue that was worked on a lot. And finally, we did get to an agreement I think about a week and a half ago or so. So, that has been very helpful in getting people to get their claims in.

MS. ZIMMERMAN: Yes, and I think that I will echo what Ms. Catullo said about the special master counseling and just making sure that all of the clients and the Plaintiffs out there have appropriate informed consent. For the benefit of anybody on the phone who has a client who would benefit from additional counseling on that, there are three Special Masters appointed that have been very instrumental in explaining the terms of the program and really what the timeline is here. So, we can assist you in any way with getting appointments set up with one of these Special Masters if that would be beneficial for your client, and we certainly welcome you doing that.

THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: And their names again for the record?

MS. ZIMMERMAN: Sure, Judge Hamlin, Judge Boylan

and Special Master Ed Gentle, as well. And we can get those set up for anybody. I know they have literally been going into the evening hours to work with people who potentially have a work schedule issue and phone calls during the night time hours are easier, the Special Masters have been a great resource for us, here.

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I think that we are also -- we hope to be on the verge of announcing another large lienholder and essentially a resolution with one more insurance company, so I encourage everybody in the MDL to watch for emails from Tony Nemo, the liaison counsel for the MDL. He is communicating deadlines for everybody and the necessary paperwork, as well. So, make sure to watch for emails from him and let us know if you have any questions in that regard.

THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: And I can just indicate, I don't think it is particularly -- anyone is asking; but, one, I had observed that cases continue to come in here to the District. And currently, we have -- well, the total is 2,566. The total open cases are 2,493. And just -- a number just came in this past week, as well, pursuant to the settlement agreement.

So, anything on that issue, Judge Noel?

THE HONORABLE MAGISTRATE JUDGE NOEL: No, I have nothing further. Thank you.

THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: All right. We can

1 move on, then, unless anybody else has any inquiry or statements on the enrollment status, we can go to No. 2. 2 3 MS. ZIMMERMAN: Thank you, Your Honor, so the next 4 issue is a jointly proposed Pretrial Order No. 26; that is, 5 we have been getting a lot of questions about how Plaintiffs' attorneys should communicate to the Court and to 6 7 the Defendants when their clients have undergone revision 8 surgery. 9 We have put together a very brief proposed 10 pretrial order jointly submitted where Plaintiffs attorneys 11 essentially indicate and notify Defendants when someone 12 undergoes a revision surgery and some very basic details 13 about that surgery. So, we would request that that be 14 approved. 15 THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: And I think both 16 parties agree to that? 17 MS. CATULLO: Yes, Your Honor. Essentially, it 18 works out very effectively in New Jersey and --19 THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: Well, I will note for 20 the record, since you sent it in well in advance of today's 21 hearing, to the extent it is relevant, it will be Pretrial Order No. 26. 2.2 23 I have had a chance to review it and we will, I 24 will sign that before the day is out. And it will be filed 25 maybe before the noon hour comes. So, that will be signed

today.

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And for anybody listening and those in the courtroom, not only does the Order address the notice of revision surgery, but the -- the order -- but there is also attached to Exhibit A to that, there is the notice, itself. So, we will have the form for that. So, we will get that done very soon.

MS. ZIMMERMAN: Okay, thank you, Your Honor.

I think with the exception of scheduling the next status conference, that is really all we had to report today.

THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: I believe we agreed on the following date, June 4th. And we would go back to the same schedule that we have been on, except for today. So, meet with counsel at 8:15 and come out here an hour later.

And obviously, with the same understanding, and I will ask Judge Noel, as well, the same understanding as we have had before, in the event, unlikely or otherwise, some other issue is coming up, and whether that is a reach out to status conference or reach out to State Judges or any other issue, I assume counsel will get ahold of us and we will do what we need to do.

Judge Noel, did you have anything?

THE HONORABLE MAGISTRATE JUDGE NOEL: No, just to reiterate or echo what you just said, that we are available

for whatever we need to be available for.

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MS. ZIMMERMAN: Thank you, Your Honors.

MS. CATULLO: Thank you.

THE HONORABLE JUDGE FRANK: Anything else? Other than for those of you that came in here from elsewhere why we couldn't order some sun? But, as I always remind people, when I first came to the Federal Court in 1998, and it always takes one's children to give you a little truth, dose of truth and reality. They said: Dad, this Federal Judgeship thing, I don't think is as big as people say it is because you can't even get us decent seats at the Target Center.

So -- and I guess that was true then, and it's still true now. But, in all seriousness, I appreciate everyone communicating, keeping us informed. And I will just also repeat, but it also echoes what Judge Noel said, if there is anything, please get ahold of us.

In other words, you will never hear from one of our chambers, well, we are not due to see you until June 4th, so don't bother us. That is not the way these MDLs work or are supposed to work. So, we wish everyone safe travels. And thanks for accommodating my schedule today, even though we got a later start today. Unless there is anything further, we will stand adjourned.
