You must answer these questions fully and truthfully.

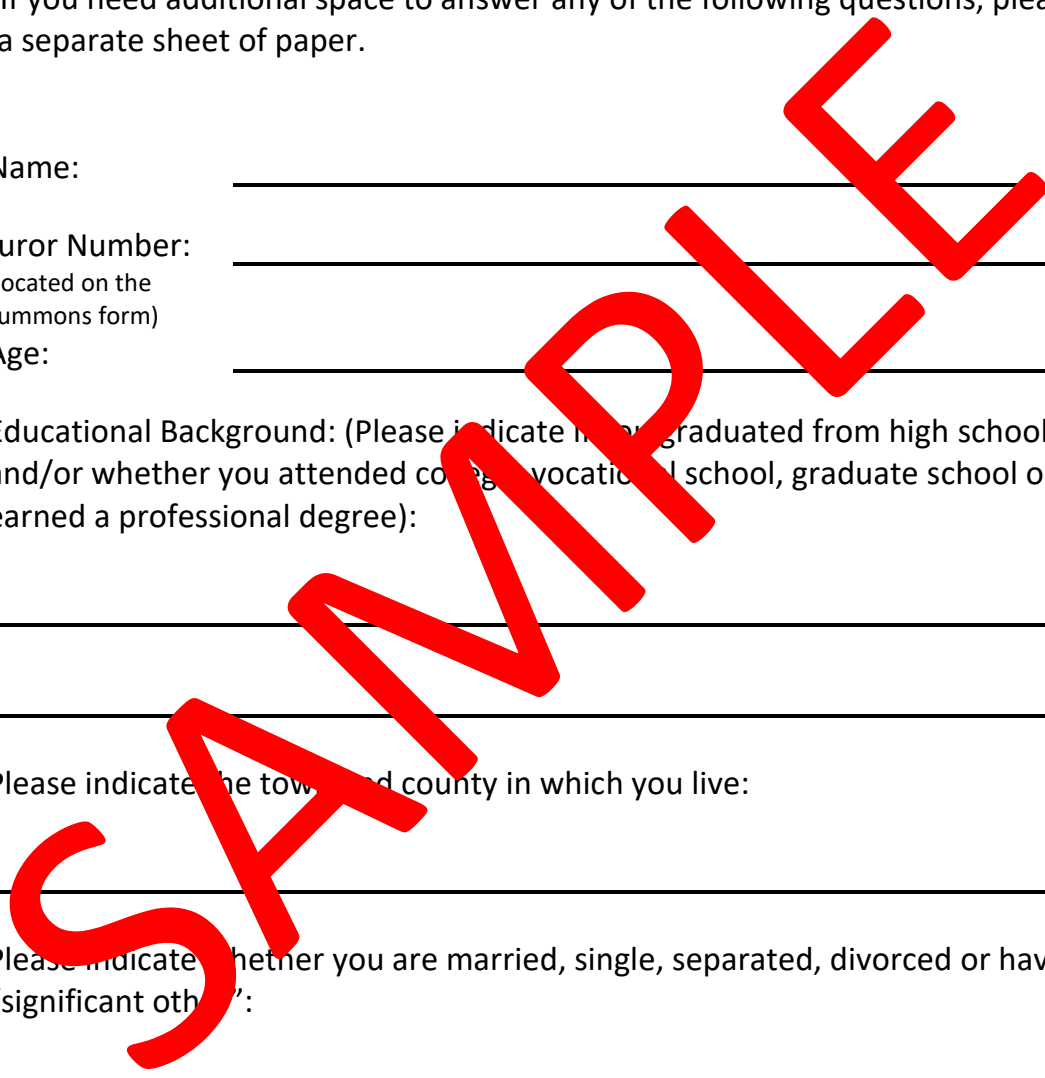

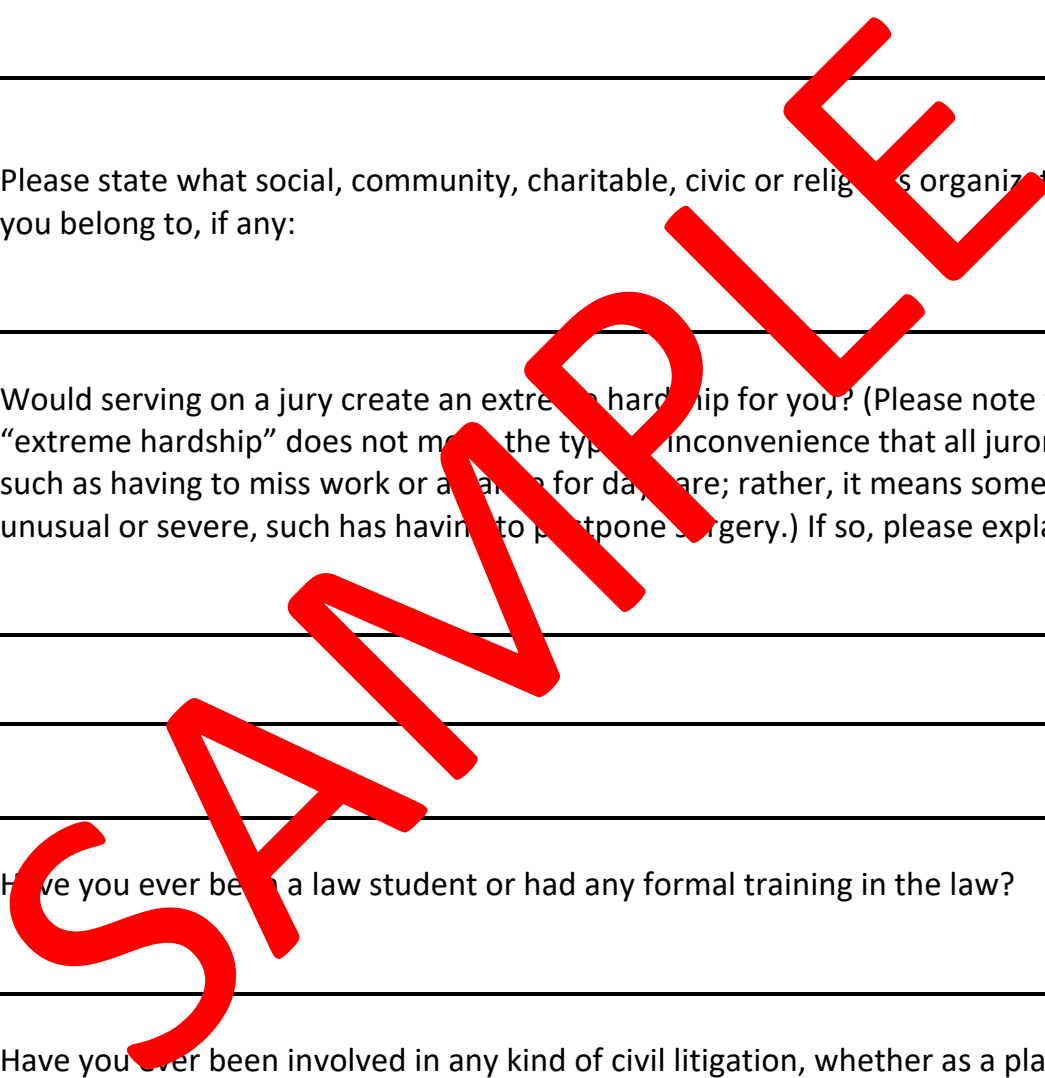
